Betty J. Kriebel Emery Hawthorne, 96, Parker Pa. went to be with her Lord and Savior on October 16, 2019, at Parker Personal Care Center.

Born in Perry Twp., Clarion County on May 30, 1923, she was the daughter of the late Lindsay and OrphaMay Gallagher Kriebel. Betty was first married to Dean Emery who passed away in 1960. She later married Paul Hawthorne in 1969 and he passed away in 2007.

Betty worked for the Karns City School District as a cook in the cafeteria at the Chicora elementary school. She also worked as a school bus driver for the Karns City School District and the ACV School District in Foxburg as well as working at the former Bantam Jeep Company in Butler.

Betty was a lifetime member of the First Church of God in Parker and later the Park Hill First Church of God in West Freedom. Over the years she served as Sunday School Superintendent, Sunday School teacher and was an active member of the Women of the Church of God (WCG) organization. Betty also was a cook for many years at Whitehall Camp and Conference Center. She began attending Camp Meetings as a young girl with her parents who owned a cottage on the grounds. Her love for the Camp Meetings never died and she enjoyed attending each year as her health permitted.

Surviving is a son, Denny and Carol Emery, New Port Richey, FL, a daughter, Cindy Emery-Papke, Emlenton, two grandsons, Mitchell Emery, Foxburg and Dean and Danielle Papke, Parker.

Two sisters survive: Pauline Slaughenhaupt and Poppy Myers, both of Parker as well as two brothers: Floyd (Hod) Kriebel of Mercer and Claude (Jaunita) Kriebel of Parker. Many nieces and nephews also survive. In addition to her parents and husbands, she was preceded in death by two brothers, Donald Kriebel and Jack Kriebel and one sister Valjean Hepner.
