BRYAN J. WENTLING, Jr., 92, of Foxburg passed away early Sunday morning (09-25-16) at VNA In-Patient Hospice at Butler following an illness. Born in St. Petersburg, Clarion Co., Pa. on December 2, 1923, he was son of late Bryan Jennings, Sr. and Gladys Naomi Francisco Wentling. Bryan served as corporal in the U.S.Army during World War II in both the European and Asian-Pacific Theaters of Operation. He was member and past commander of VFW Post 7073 of Parker and member and past commander of American Legion Post 636 of Foxburg. He was a longtime member of Memorial Church of Our Father - Episcopal at Foxburg, where he served on the church council for many years. Bryan also served on the Bishop's Committee of the Episcopal Church. He was employed at Republic Steel in Warren, Ohio from 1947 to 1950, employed eight years with the B&O Railroad, and then spent a career with former Glass Containers Corp. at Parker from where he retired in 1981 with 23 years of service. Active in the community of Foxburg, he served on the borough council, water authority, and was a trustee of both the Foxburg Library and the Foxburg (church) Cemetery. He is survived by his wife Elizabeth J. Gormely Wentling, and a number of nieces and nephews. In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by sister Helene Grace White and brother John R. Wentling. A private family and friends visitation was held Tuesday afternoon at Buzard Funeral Home in Parker where a funeral service was held at 1:00 PM. Interment was made in Foxburg Cemetery.
