MARY ALICE KEEFER, 88, of Butler, formerly of West Monterey, passed away Friday morning (12-21-12) at Concordia Health Center, Cabot, following an illness. Born in West Monterey, Pa. on July 16, 1924, she was the daughter of the late George and Zula Williams Daubenspeck. Mary Alice was a graduate of the former Emlenton High School. She served in World War II with the U. S. Navy from 1944 to 1946. She was honorably discharged with the rank of Seaman First Class, and was awarded the Victory Medal and the American Campaign Medal. Mrs. Keefer and her late husband, Claude, were long time members of the Park Hill Church of God at West Freedom. Following his passing, she moved to Butler, and became active at Hill U. P. Church. She enjoyed her time being a member of the Red Hat Ladies Group. Surviving are a son, David G.
